This Indenture made this 24th day of February eight
hundred and three; Between Richard Blunt and Henry his
wife of Southampton, Virginia, of the one part and Samuel
Smith of Northampton, N^o Carolina of the other part. Witnesseth
that Whereas John Blunt late of Southampton County, died intestate
leaving a considerable estate in lands and ^{other} property, and whereas the
heirs of the said John Blunt dec^d did by their Bills and Petitions
go into the Courts of Southampton County and pray a division of the
estate of said dec^d, according to law, and the sd Court did decree that
certain Commissioners should be appointed to view the said estate between
the several heirs, and report their proceedings to the Court in due
for official decree, and whereas the sd Commissioners did go on the
premises and lay the lands of said dec^d into four parcels in lots
and did assign to Richard Blunt lot N^o 2 containing
eight hundred and twenty acres which is bounded as follows to
(W^o) Beginning at a Holly tree on the side of parcel
known a corner tree in lot N^o 1 on thence along a line
of marked trees lately Chopped N. E. to a pine in corner of
