This Indenture made the twenty fourth day of May in the year of our Lord Christ, 1805, Between Wm Barnes of one part, Matthew Calvert of the second part, and Josiah Vick of the third part all of the County of Staff and State of Virg. Witnesseth that whereas the said Matthew Calvert upon the special Request of the said William Barnes hath become bound with the said Barnes in a certain Bond bearing the same ^{rate} with the Presents, given to William Woodland of the said County of the sum of Fifty pounds current money of Virginia, payable on or before the second day of April in the year 1805. and whereas the said William Barnes is willing and desirous of securing and indemnifying the said Matthew Calvert in becoming bound with him as security in the said bond. Now This Indenture Witnesseth, that the said William Barnes for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar, to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released, confirmed, and by these presents doth hereby, grant, bargain, sell, alien, release, and confirm unto the said Josiah Vick his heirs executors administrators two certain pieces or parcels of land lying and being situate in the parish of Westmore County of South Hampton and the first one being the tract that the said William Barnes Purchased of the said Josiah Vick and bounded by the River James then of Britain ed. in the said Vick's deed of bargainment, to the said Barnes & duly recorded in the standing Court of Southampton reference, then & to be fully appear containing by estimation fifty Acres (to the same more or less) the other tract being all the lands belonging to the said
