on the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
Witnesseth that the s^d. Francis Clements & Rebecca Clements for and in
consideration of the sum of Ninety pounds current money of Virginia
to them p^d. the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, have granted,
bargained and sold unto the s^d. Ellis G. Blake a certain tract or parcel
of land lying and being situate in the County of Southampton adjoining
the lands of the s^d. Blake, the lands of Peter Blair, the land of the Wythe
of John Taylor and the lands of Michael Leonard; the same being thereof
set apart and allotted to the widow of Henry Taylor and Rebecca Clements
and containing by Survey one hundred and eighty Acres more or less to be sold
with all improvements, Tenements & Householdments thereunto belonging
in any case appertaining to have and to hold to him the said Ellis
G. Blake and his heirs during the natural life of her the s^d. Rebecca Clements
hereby Relinquish all their right title and claim whatsoever to the said
