Between Richard Whitehead and Peggy his wife both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the
said Richard Whitehead and Peggy his wife hath for and in Consideration
of the Sum of Six hundred and twenty five Dollars to them in hand paid
Grant bargained and sold by these Presents with grant bargain
sell unto the s^d William Whitehead his heirs and assigns forever
All that Land and Plantation which descended to them the s^d Richard
in a Division of his father's land to wit, Beginning at Blum's corner
Running up the branch that is called the Great Pond branch to the
fork then up the North Fork two white oaks that is the corner to the
the corner land of Blum's Whitehead and the s^d land from thence a
straight line to Sam^l Edwards line at the opposite corner on the
s^d branch to the glaucous swamp over the s^d Swamp to the beginning
containing Fifty Acres by the same more or less I have
to hold unto the s^d William Whitehead his heirs and assigns forever
peace and singular for the s^d fifty five acres of land and Tenises
Together with all houses, orchards, ways, waters, & watercourses with them
the s^d W^m Whitehead his heirs and assigns forever — and Peggy his
wife (or her) her heirs and assigns forever the title of the s^d land and
appurtenances, against the claims of themselves their heirs executors and
administrators and against the claim and demand of all and every
other person and Persons whatsoever — In Witness whereof these
Richard Whitehead and Peggy his wife have hereunto set
their hands and seals this 20th day of February 1804
