

351 Be it known unto all Persons unto whom this instrument of writing shall come that I being desirous of emancipating a Mulatto Slave named Jim, do hereby emancipate and make free the said Jim forever so he shall be obedient to the sd. Jim his heirs &c. against any Person claiming in or for me - Witness my hand and seal this 20th day of February 1804 -

This Indenture made this 27th day of January 1805, between John George of the County of Southampton of the first part and William Jackson of the County of Sussex of the second part, and Mark Jackson of the County of Southampton of the third part Witnesseth that the s^d John George, grants in consideration of the sum of two hundred and forty three pounds current money of England to him in hand paid by s^d William Jackson and two shillings for s^d Mark Jackson the receipt whereof he hath here by acknowledged, bargain, sold, aliened, released and confirmed by these presents both grant, bargain, sell, alien, release and confirm unto the s^d William Jackson and to his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns or parcels of land, which he the s^d John George purchased of the s^d William Jackson, containing two hundred twenty nine acres and 75 acres to the same more or less, it being in the County of Southampton - So have said to him the s^d Jacob of said estate its appurtenances unto the s^d Mark Jackson his heirs etc. Right to him and their own proper use and behoof of themselves in that behalf for the especial purpose here after mentioned & to have that in case the s^d John George, his heirs etc. and assigns or assigns shall fail to pay the s^d Mark Jackson the s^d sum of two hundred and forty three pounds two shillings together with all legal interests therein due arising in consequence of this present writing, on or before 1st of October, Domini 1805 or within twenty days thereafter, that then the s^d Mark Jackson his heirs etc. or assigns may legally in and upon s^d public Auction make sale of the s^d bargain'd premises with or without the same to the purchaser in full discharge, without any little or molestation from or by the said John George, or his heirs etc. or assigns and the s^d John George doth further covenants and agrees with the s^d Mark Jackson his heirs etc. Administrators that this present writing shall make him to make a famous Warranty for the s^d land to the purchaser provided the purchaser of any after pay the s^d sum of two hundred and forty three pounds two shillings together
