This Indenture made this fifteenth day of December 1814 between
 William Pelworth of St. Louis County of the one part and Wm. W. Parker of
 Hannibal County of the other part, Witness that the s^d William
 Pelworth in order to secure a debt of two hundred and thirty seven
 Dollars and no part on his note of this date, and in consideration of one dollar
 to him in hand p^d by the s^d Wm. W. Parker at or before the making
 and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is here by taken by
 the s^d W. W. Pelworth, hath granted bargained and sold unto the s^d
 Wm. W. Parker all that certain tract or parcel of land lying
 on the north side of Mottoway River, at a place called and known
 by the name of the Round Gut in the County of St. James Begins
 at a bypass standing on Mottoway River just above the Mouth
 of the Round Gut a corner tree of Elizabeth Hollow, thence bearing
 her line, about or North east Course through the Pecoron to the mouth of
 a Deep branch, thence still bearing on her line up the s^d branch to
 various corner about or North Course to a large dead gum a corner tree
 thence about a South East Course, along James Gustafson and Branch
 Cold line, to a small branch near the ship yard, thence down this
 branch touching the land of Isaac Smith deceased to the s^d Round
 Gut, thence bearing on the north side of the s^d Round Gut to the beginning
 containing by estimation seventy two and one half acres also more or
 less about 18 years old, bound by the s^d John Dulaney and various
 persons now alive and deceased, and other parts of land and
 thence, and every part and Parcel thereof and also all the
 right title Interest Claim and Demand whatsoever with all the
 inequality of him the s^d William Pelworth in or to the s^d land
