This Indenture made this 10th day of Feb^y 1804 between Timothy Thap of the County of Franklin and State of North Carolina and Jane his wife of the one part, and Henry Thap of the County of Southampton of the other part, Witnesseth that the s^d Timothy Thap and Jane his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of ~~Twenty~~ ^{Twenty} Pounds Virginia money in hand paid by the s^d Henry Thap in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these Presents do, each of them with bargain and sell, unto the s^d Henry Thap, his heirs or assigns forever, on Certain piece or tract of land, lying and being in the s^d County of Southampton, on the South side of the Creek containing by late Survey twenty four Acres, be the same more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at a Red Oak thence N. 40 E. 180 paces white oak in Robbins Branch thence down the s^d Branch to a white gum thence North 21 E. 170 p. to the beginning, it being the whole of the land due to his part, That he do give unto the estate of Samuel Thap and assigned as the senior lot in the division of the s^d Henry Thap's land. To have and to hold the s^d 24 Acres of land, with the tennements and all and singular, the profits and Advantages arising therefrom, unto the s^d Henry Thap his heirs and assigns forever and the s^d Timothy Thap and Jane his wife, for themselves and their heirs their heirs with all and singular the premises and Appurtenances, as do warrant and perform, defend unto the s^d Henry Thap his heirs and assigns forever from the let, hindrance of them the s^d Timothy Thap and Jane his wife, and from all person or persons claiming by or from them.
