This Indenture made on the Eighteenth day of January 1802
between Randolph Newsum and Sally his wife of the County of Stafford
David Newsum of the same County of Stafford the other party
the s^d Randolph and Sally in consideration of the sum of one
Thousand pounds lawful money of Virg^a the receipt which is
hereby acknowledged, granted bargain and sold, and by these
present covenants, grant, bargain and sell unto the s^d David Newsum and his
heirs the following lands and Premises Namely the tract of land
of land whereon Philip Person the father of the s^d Patey resided at
the time of his decease lying in the County of Stafford being part
of the same lands that I purchased of the s^d David & Patey his wife
Containing four hundred and seventy Acre also a tract of parcel of
land in the same County called the Quarter land Plantation
near Taylors Bridge Containing three hundred and forty six Acre
also a tract or parcel of land in the same County situated near the
Three Creeks adjoining the lands of Charles B. Nicholson Britons 1241
Acre (by patent) also an undivided moiety of a tract or parcel of
land in the same County on Flat Swamp Commonly called the Church
lands, also all the right title and Interest of in and to the same tract
or parcel of land in Warren County on Stone House Creek in North
Carolina to which several tracts or parcels of lands the s^d Randolph
became entitled by purchase of the s^d David and Patey, To have
to hold the aforesaid tract or parcels of land with their Appurtenances
to him the s^d David Newsum his heirs Executors & Admin^{rs} the s^d tract
or parcels of land together with their Appurtenances to him the s^d David
Newsum his heirs and assigns shall and will forever warrant and defend
