This Acknowledgment made the 5th day of March Anno Domini 1804 before
 Robert Tucker and Henry his wife of Dorchester County of the One part and
 Benjamin Wrenn of Hampshire County of the other part Witnesses that the
 said Robert and Henry for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds
 then in hand paid by the said Benjamin Wrenn, the receipt whereof they ac-
 knowledge hereby Acknowledge that the said Robert Tucker and Henry his wife have
 granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell
 unto the said Benjamin Wrenn and to his heirs and assigns forever all that
 Interest right and title to two certain tract or parcels of land in Hampshire
 County supposed to contain four hundred and eighty six Acres (be the same
 more or less) it being the land whereon Thomas Williams now lives in the end
 Side of the Beacon Swamp and is bounded as follows (beginning at a
 Post or mark in the said Swamp on Robert Nicholas long long thence along
 the said Nicholas line to Rowden Selks line thence along Selks line to the
 line of the land belonging to the estate of John Rowden Deed thence along the
 said line to Howell Bonham line thence along the said line to the Beacon
 Swamp thence upon the various courses of the said Swamp to the (beginning)
 And also the reversion and remainder and remainders thereof together
 with all the Estate right title property claim and Demand whatsoever
 to the said tract or parcel of land belonging, To have and to hold
 the said land and premises with all the Appurtenances thereto belong-
 ing unto him the said Benjamin Wrenn his heirs and assigns forever of the one
 proper use and behoof of him the said Benjamin Wrenn his heirs and
 assigns forever and they the said Robert Tucker and Henry his wife do
 them selves their heirs and assigns the said tract or parcel of land and
 premises with all and singular the Appurtenances unto the said Benjamin
 Wrenn his heirs and assigns Against the Claim of them the said Robert
 and Henry and their heirs and assigns and do warrant and firm the said
 Acknowledgment.
