This Indenture was made this 4th day of August in the year of our Lord
1844 Between Benjamin W. Schuster and Mary his wife of the County of
Southampton of the one part and Nathaniel Fitz of the County of Hampshire of the
other part. Whereof it is, That the said Benjamin W. Schuster and his
wife hath for the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars to them in hand
the receipt they are hereby Acknowledged, That grants Benjamin and his
wife unto the said Nathaniel Fitz his heirs and Assigns, one certain lot of
building in the town of Jerusalem, which he the said Benjamin W. Schuster
purchased of Edwin Gray, a person being here to the said Deed was
brought in more fully appear. To have and to hold the said
building unto him the said Nathaniel Fitz his heirs and Assigns
from against the Claim of him the said Benjamin W. Schuster and his
wife their heirs and Assigns and against the Claim of any other
person whatsoever. Witness these Presents given warrant and Deed
in the County of Hampshire the 4th day of August 1844
