 by these presents doth grant bargain and sell and deliver unto the said James
 Jackson the following of slaves namely cleaning Jester, Carter, Nancy, James
 Chas. Name, No. 200 and to holds the said slaves unto the said James
 Jackson his heirs free to the only proper use of him the said Jackson. Upon the
 inferior condition, that in case the said John Bynum shall die
 before payment of the above mentioned sum of eight hundred and
 twenty dollars & cents, that he the said James Jackson may and may after
