1813 This Indenture made this 20th day of February in the year of our Lord Christ
1814, Between James Byrce and Sarah his wife of the County of Sampson of the one
part, and Henry Blunt of the said County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said
James Byrce and Sarah his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of twenty pounds
Seven Shillings, Terguwa money to him in hand paid by the said Henry Blunt the
Receipt thereof, the said James Byrce doth hereby Acknowledge to be fully satisfied
and paid, hath bargained, sold, alienated, released and confirmed and doth by these
presents, fully and absolutely give bargain, sell, and confirm unto the said Henry
Blunt his heirs or assigns forever, one Certain tract or parcel of Land, Containing
two hundred and fourteen and one half Acre, being the same more or less lying and situate
in the said County of Sampson, and bounded as follows. Beginning at a corner
between John Byrce and James Jackson and more Thence N. 85° E. 1/2
Thence S. 85° E. to the sum of a double branch, thence up the run of the said branch
120 paces to the said Byrce and James Jackson Thence N. 55° E. 30 paces to a corner
into a corner in Arthur Darners line, Thence along the said Darners line N. 71° E.
to a white oak, Thence N. 51° E. 110 paces to a pine, Thence S. 85° E. 1/2
a Hickory, thence N. 55° E. 110 paces to a pine which is found in
Lewis line, thence along the said Harris line S. 75° E. 190 paces to a corner
