

This Indenture made this 1st day of Decemr 1803 in Randolph Newum,
 Richard P. Clements and Frederick Parker, of the County of Sampson, Commissioners
 appointed by the court of the said County to see the lands of William Chambliss
 Deceased on part and Thomas Graves Chambliss of the said County of the other
 part, With respect for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and ninety
 eight pence, seven shillings and six pence half penny, to us in hand paid the
 Thence seen as before the sealing and delivery of these presents, with the said and convey
 to the right estate of one tract or parcel of land of the said County containing
 two hundred Eighty nine and one third, Acres, to the same more or less, to the said
 Thomas G. Chambliss, and his heirs forever, with all the Appurtenances thereto in law
 and in equity as follows (to wit) Beginning at a Red Oak corner of
 said Chambliss deat and Richard P. Clements, and running S. 4th W. 111 p. to a
 Black Gum in the Hornet Swamp, thence down the various courses of said line
 to John McGowan's line, thence along said line North 10th East 102 p. to
 a White Oak in the flat Branch, a corner of John McGowan and said Cham-
 bliss and thence up the various courses of said branch to a white oak corner
 of said Chambliss and William Newsum and said McGowan, thence S. 11th W.
 to John McGowan's line, thence to 7th W. 45 p. to a Post
 in said line, thence S. 55th W. 130 p. to the beginning of the above and to hold
 the said land with all and every Appurtenances thereto belonging from us the
 said Randolph Newsum, Richard P. Clements, and Frederick Parker on their
 refusal or any other person or persons claiming by themselves or in law
 when the said Thomas G. Chambliss, to his heirs, assigns and behoofers
 forever, for which whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our
 seals the 1st day of Decemr 1803.
