This Indenture made this 18th day of May in the year of our one thousand
Eight hundred between Isaac Wick and Elizabeth his wife of the County of
Sampson of the one part and William Wightman & son of the County of Sampson
of the other part Witnesseth that the said Isaac Wick and Elizabeth his wife
for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and Eighty pounds current
money of Virginia to them in hand paid at or before the making and delivery
of this present, the receipt whereof the said Isaac Wick and Elizabeth his wife
with his duly Acknowledged and that of Acquittance and Discharge the said
Wightman and son their heirs and assigns forever, hath granted bargained
Sold and sold by this present grant bargain and sell, one certain lot or
parcel of Land lying and being in the town of Somoletts and County of
Southampton and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning on the west side
of the main street whereof the line of the Court house ground extends the
said street, thence along the line of the Court house ground one hundred and
Ninety eight feet to the River, thence down the River one hundred and thirty
four rods to the corner of number 3 Thence along the line of St. J. 23 feet
6 inches to the main street and thence along the said street 104 feet & back
to the beginning - being the same Lot the said Isaac Wick purchased of
John Wright to gether with all the Appurtenances belonging thereto he
have used to hold the said Lot separate of Land with the Coffin and
unto the said Wm Wightman and son their heirs and assigns forever and
the said Isaac Wick and Elizabeth his wife for them selves and their heirs
doth covenant and Agree to and with the said William Wightman & son
and their heirs and assigns shall and may at all times hereafter lawfully
and peaceably possess and enjoy the above mentioned Land and premises
freedom all incumbrances whatsoever and that the said Isaac Wick
and Elizabeth his wife the said Lot separate of Land with their heirs
and assigns shall and may at all times hereafter lawfully and peaceably
