Indenture with the receipt endorse was proved by the oaths of William
Bailey Jun^r Magistrate and Edward Bailey the Witness thereto, and with a
commission and certificate of its execution was returned and ordered to be
recorded.

This Indenture made this 26th day of March in the year 1799 between John
Bynum & Orfeiller his wife of the one part & Isaac Byrd, James Byrd, Sally Byrd,
and said Byrd of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Bynum & Orfeiller
his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty eight
pounds Current money of Virginia the receipt whereof is hereby Acknowledged
have granted bargained sold aliened released & confirmed & by this pre-
sents assign grant bargain and sell alien release and Confirm unto the said Isaac Byrd,
Sally Byrd and said Byrd a certain plantation tract or parcel of Land lying
and being in the County of Southampton & containing by Estimation Three hundred
and one Acre and a half more or less and bounded as follows to wit
Beginning at a white oak in Northern Turners line North S. W. 3/4 pole to a
corner thence N. 57° E. 37 1/2 pole to a white oak thence North 25° 1/2 pole
to a yellow oak thence N. 51° E. 62 poles to a pine thence S. 67° 30' pole to a
white oak thence S. 85° 16 pole to a pine thence N. 78° 8 1/2 pole to a pine
thence N. 47° E. 34 pole to a black gum thence 75° E. 38 pole to a white oak thence N. 75°
pole to a white oak in Asphite Williams line thence S. 15° W. 100 pole to a white
oak in S. Duckham thence up the various Cuts is 26 1/2 pole to a white oak
in Turners line thence N. 25° or 26° W. 10 pole to — thence N. 26°
W. 10 pole to a sweet gum thence N. 25° W. 5 1/2 pole to the beginning and
thence more and less as aforesaid and remaining unto the said Isaac Byrd
his wife and every part thereof to have and to hold the said plantation
tract and one fourth of land and premises with the appurtenances unto the
said Isaac Byrd, James Byrd, & Sally Byrd and their heirs. Bearing to the only daughter
one of them their line between and the said John Bynum & Orfeiller line
