This Indenture made this 1st day of December in the year of
 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and 1884 and in the year
 of the Commonwealth of Boston Nicholas Bister and Penelope his
 wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and William
 Lawrence of the County of Isle of Wight of the other Parte witness
 doth declare that the said Nicholas Bister and Penelope his wife for and in
 consideration of the sum of one hundred and two pounds ten shillings
 lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said
 Lawrence at or before the ensaing of and delivery of these presents
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and
 by these presents do grant bargain and sell and deliver unto the said William
 Lawrence his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land formerly the
 land of Giles Johnson lying and being in the County of Southampton and parish
 of Mataway containing by late Survey one hundred and ten acres to
 same more or less, and bounded as follows (W.S.) beginning at a pine
 a corner tree standing on the hog pen branch between the said two
 S. E. Council and John Lester, thence along the said Lester line
 due East 179' pole to a gum, then N. 37° E. 23 pole to a pine then
 S. 64° E. 2 poles, then S. 58° E. 114' pole to a branch then down the
 of the said branch S. 35° W. 89' pole to a corner Willow oak Boston
 the said Land lying Cribbs and John Johnson's then N. 36°
 W. 8 poles, then N. 46° W. 30 poles then E. 51° W. 78 poles to
 Willow oak in said Johnson's line then E. 41° W. 33 poles, then
 S. 26° W. 12 poles to the mouth of the hog pen branch then
 the various courses of the said branch to the beginning again
 with all and singular the houses gardens orchards lands trees
 meadows pastures commonage woods in common ways water and
 water courses, servitudes profits committes, tenancies, emoluments
 & consistments and apprentices, whatsoever to the said belonging
 or appertaining, or with the same used or enjoyed or occupied
 or known as part hereto or therefrom or as belonging to
 the same or used part thereof, and the person who now
