ye that, I Francis Wick of the County of Sampson and State of North
Carolina in consideration of the maternal love and affection which
I bear and do bear unto my son Francis Wick but more especially for
the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid
at or before the signing, sealing and delivery of these presents, the
Receipt whereof, I solemnly Acknowledge have given and granted
by these presents with hereby give and grant unto my said
son Francis Wick one certain negro boy called and known by the
name of Jack returning to my self and to my wife Sarah
the use and Labour of the said negro boy Jack for and during
our and each of our natural lives To have and to hold the
said negro boy Jack unto my said son Francis Wick and
to his heirs and assigns forever except as is before excepted the said
