To all to whom this present writing shall come greeting I shew
 Ye that I Council Wick of the County of Southampton and State of
 Virginia for and in Commemoration Love and Affection which I have and
 do have to my daughter Michael Wick but more especially for and
 in consideration of the sum of one dollar have given and granted and
 by these presents doth hereby give and grant unto my said daughter
 Michael Wick one certain negro boy called and known by the name
 of Nat^l also one myr of Iron and fender and one feather bed
 and furniture To have and to hold the said negro boy Nat^l and also
 one myr of Iron and fender and one feather bed and furniture
 unto my said daughter Michael Wick and to her heirs and assigns
 forever retaining nevertheless to my self and to my wife South Wick
 the use and Labor of the said negro boy and also the use of
 one myr of Iron and fender and the use of the said feather
 bed and furniture for and during our and each of our natural lives
