 infinitely satisfied contented and paid, and doth grant bargain &
 sell, alien and confirm and by these presents doth gra-
 bargain, sell, alien and confirm unto the said Mille Griffin his
 heirs and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of land lying and be-
 lying in the aforesaid Parish and County within the North side of said
 Creek containing by Estimation two hundred and three acres &
