This Indenture made 15th day of October Anno Domini
1804 Between Robert Gosselyn Thomas Ridley James Wilkins
John Taylor and Edwin Gray Gentlemen Trustees as appointed by
an Act of Assembly of Virginia, bearing date December the 7th
Anno Domini 1791; for the purpose of laying off, at
by the name of Jerusalem, on the lands of Joseph and William
Seth adjoining the Court house of Southampton of the one
part, and Joshua Post of the other; Witnesseth that the said
Trustees as aforesaid for and in consideration of five pounds
Money of Virginia to be paid by the said J. Post pursuant
to the aforesaid Act to the said Joseph and William Seth
do bargain sell alien and Confirm unto the said J. Post and
his heirs forever one lot or parcel of land lying and being in
the Town of Jerusalem Number eight hundred as follows
Beginning on the West side of the main Street at the
corner of Lot No. Seven, thence along the East side of
Lot No. Nine, ninety feet four inches to Capt. Josiah Vick's
land (a small Slip of land lying between the said Town and
John Underwood's Land) thence along the Land of Capt.
Josiah Vick two hundred and thirty seven feet nine inches
to the main Street thence along the main Street ninety
feet four inches to the Beginning; To Have and to hold
the said Lot or parcel of land with the Appurtenances thereto
belonging to the said J. Post and his heirs forever, and the
said J. Post do covenant and agree in the manner and
form following, (Vizt) that he the said J. Post do his
him share and view build on the said Lot Number eight
a dwelling house sixteen feet square at least, with a brick
Chimney to be fit for habitation in ten years from the Seventh day
of December Anno Domini 1801 agreeable to the Act
of Assembly allowing further time for building, under said
Lots, which Act bear date the third day of January
Anno Domini 1803 - and also do promise to pay the
Money arising from the sale of the said Lot to the
