 fifty four pounds four shillings and four pence half penny to them
 in hand paid by the said Samuel Jackson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 that the said Anthony Anderson and wife have granted bargained
 and sold Allms enffees and Confirmed unto the said Samuel Jackson his
 heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land containing by
 Estimation fifty acres and of more or less Situate lying and
 being in the County of Sampson in the tract used heretofore and
 known as follows (To wit) Beginning at a corner of the same
 corner runs thence along in line N 75° E to a red oak, then N 75° E
