Dollars have sold many of the premises in and by the said Michajah Griffen
the receipt whereof the said Richard B. Blackshin and Lucy B. Blackshin his
wife certify to be true and correct, and in full satisfaction of the said debt
of one hundred and twenty Dollars and confirmed and by the said parties
and by the said Michajah Griffen his wife so
a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of
Southampton the north side of the said road containing by Estimation thirty acres
