This Indenture made the 20th day of May 1805 between George Edwards and Sally Edwards of the one part and Joseph Burgess of the other part both of Southampton County Westmoreland that the said George Edwards and his wife Sally Edwards for and in consideration of the sum of thirty seven pounds, three shillings, seven pence money of Virginia have bargained sold and confirmed unto the said Joseph Burgess his heirs and assigns forever one tract or parcel of Land lying & being in Sampson General Containing two easy more Acre and some less as follows: Beginning at a white Oak in a small stream being the limits of Medbury this land thence by the various Curves of the said stream thirty four poles to a corner tree of Joseph Burgess thence by his line forty four poles to a corner in another branch thence by the various Curves of the stream to another corner thence by two poles thence by a line thirty four poles to the beginning with all improvements, common profits & appurtenances belong or appertaining to the said Land and also all the right title Interest claim and Demand of him the said George Edwards and his wife in or to the premises, To have and to hold the same as above limits Joseph Burgess his heirs and assigns forever. In Witness whereof I George Edwards with my wife Sally have set our hands and Seals to it day and year as above.
