and Nathan Williams for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty five pounds
in hand paid by said Wmelle as bargains sold and deliver and by these presents
have bargains sold and delivered unto him the said Wmelle a certain negro
woman named Phillis with all her future Increase which said Phillis
with her property was heretofore conveyed by deed of Trust bearing date the
13th day of May in the year 1800 executed by said James Edwards and
Williams as trustee for the benefit of the said Wmelle I the said Williams
do for myself my heirs and all my representatives release and quit claim
to the said negro Phillis unto the said Wmelle and I the said Edwards
do for myself my heirs and all my representatives warrant the right title
of the said negro to the said Wmelle against the claims or demands of
all persons whatsoever In Witness whereof we have hereunto set
our hands and affixed our seals this 15th day of July 1805

Between Nathan Parrott and his wife Elizabeth of the Parish of Netley
and County of Southampton Virginia of the one part and Benjamin Watson
of the County and Parish aforesaid of the other Part Witnesseth
that the said Nathan Parrott and Elizabeth his wife for and in
consideration of the sum of three hundred Dollars current money
of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Benjamin Watson
on or before the signing sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof the said Nathan Parrott with his by act and assent
and himself therewith fully and inwardly satisfied contents and paid
