 of these presents, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, the said
 presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien and convey
 here and assign unto the said William Lawrence his
 heirs and assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of land lying and
 being in the County aforesaid, containing by Estimation Sixty Acres
 a half more or less, more or less, and bounded as follows: To wit
 at the West Part where the said John Johnson and Mary standing
 at the side of Perry Bridge Road there along side of marked trees
 to mark ground a corner tree of Benjamin Wells, one standing
