after peaceably and quietly possess and enjoy the said Land and
premises herein mentioned or intended to be hereby granted, without
any lawful hindrance or trouble of him the said William
Gray his heirs executors administrators or assigns or any other person or
persons claiming by or under them and the said William Gray
and Lydia his wife their heirs &c. all right title and interest
as has been conveyed to them by the aforesaid Benjamin Gray
to the aforesaid Land and premises, unto the said Whitehead his heirs
and assigns shall and will warrant and forever defend the same
against the claims of any person or persons whatsoever. In Witness
