This Indenture made the 20th day of March in the
year four Lord 1808 Between David Westrooke Joel Westrooke
Samuel Hill Westrooke and Phoebe Westrooke heirs and Coheirs
and representatives of Senia Turner Westrooke Dec^d of the County
of Stampton of the one part and Hannah Westrooke of the
said County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said David
Westrooke, Joel Westrooke, Samuel, Hill, Westrooke and Phoebe
Westrooke for and in Consideration of the sum of the sum of
ten Pounds in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
have granted and sold and with by these presents bargained and
alien and confirmed unto Hannah Westrooke her heirs and assigns
one certain tract parcel or piece of Land Lying and being in
the County of Stampton and Parish of St. Lukes on the South
side of the three Creeks and on the South side of Georges Branch
and bounded as follows, Beginning at the mouth of the great
Pond thence thence up Georges Branch to the mouth of the Deep
thence thence up the Deep bottom to a spruce pine in the head of
the said bottom thence along, thence along Bradford News and
Dec^d line to a spruce corner tree between William Byrnes Dec^d
and James Atkins from thence to the Beginning containing by
Estimation one hundred acres or the same more or less it being
the Land that formerly belonged to a certain blong John and
sold by the said John and unto Samuel Westrooke from whom the
said Samuel Westrooke derived it, To Have and to Hold the
said one hundred acres of Land with all and singular the
Appurtenances thereto belonging or in any manner appurtenant
unto the said Hannah Westrooke her heirs & assigns forever—
