This Indenture made this 3rd day of December in the
year of our Lord 1815 between Peter Moore and others his wife &
the one part and William Green of the other part, It is hereby
That the said Peter Moore for and in consideration of four Dollars
to him in hand paid by the said William Green at or before the
making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is
hereby admitted, hath granted bargained, sold, aliened in parts
conveyed and confirmed unto the said William Green, all those
pieces, parcels, tract or lot of land in the County of Southampton
situate as follows to-wit: Beginning at the road called Southdown
road at a Lightwood post, thence down the said road to Sautley
line another Lightwood post, thence westerwardly to a marked white
oak a corner tree ^{between} the Land of the said Foleys and the Land which
formerly belonged to the estate of Janguardina dec^d now the lands of
Theophilus Daughtry and the lands hereby conveyed thence Southwardly
along said Daughtry's line to the land of Shadrach Griffon thence along
the line of Griffon to the first Statute containing estimation
one acre, more or less, and all houses, buildings, ways, waters, rights,
tenements and hereditaments thereto belonging and the reversion and
reversions remainder and remainders, rents, issues profits and conduits
ments to have and to hold the said lands and appurtenances unto
The said William Green and his heirs forever in full and absolute
free Simple and the said Peter Moore for himself and his heirs
covenants to and with the said William Green his heirs and assigns as
follows (to wit) That at the time of executing these presents the lands and
appurtenances aforesaid are subject to no lien claim or in Cumberance whatever
but that he is seignior thereof in full and absolute simple and has full power
and lawful authority to convey the same and that he and his heirs will forever
warrant protect and defend the said lands and appurtenances unto the said
