This Indenture made this 9th day of December
in the year of our Lord Christ 1805 between Jacob Barnes and
Melisent his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and
Edgington Jinner of the aforesaid County of the other part
Witnesseth that the said Jacob Barnes and Melisent his wife
for and in consideration of the just and full sum of sixty six
dollars, to them in hand paid by the said Edgington Jinner, at or
before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof
the said Jacob Barnes and Melisent his wife, doth hereby acknow-
ledge themselves therewith to be fully satisfied Contented and paid,
they the said Jacob Barnes and Melisent his wife, having granted
bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents
doth grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said Ed-
gington Jinner his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel
of land, situated lying and being in the County aforesaid
containing by admeasure to thirty three acres and bounded
as follows (to wit) Beginning at a lightwood post at the road
that leads from Jerusalem to Blackwater bridge running
N. 60° E. 60 poles to a pine: a corner tree of Lewis Hunt, Jacob
Barnes, and Edgington, Jinner, thence N. 75° E. 30 poles to white oak
Branch, thence up said branch to 60° W. 7 1/2 poles to a small
oak standing in a small branch a corner of Jacob Barnes &
Edgington Jinner thence the various courses of said branch to
a black gum a corner tree said line, thence South 40° E. 38 poles
to a pine a corner of said Barnes and Jinner - thence S. 22° W. 17 1/2
to a pine, thence a straight line to the first Station - with all
houses roads ways water and water courses, profits, Commodities
Hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same
belonging or in any wise appurtenanting and etc. reason &
Reversion remanent and remainder unto & profits thereof and
the estate right, title, Interest Interest Claim and demand of
them the said Jacob Barnes and Melisent his wife, of right
to the same or any part or parcel thereof. To have &
to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the premises
unto him the said Edgington Jinner his heirs and assigns forever
