This Indenture made the 18th day of January
1806 between Mills Hatfield Rebecca Hatfield his wife and James
Johnson his mother all of Southampton County of the one part and
Mills Laurence of Isle of Wight County of the other part - Witness
that the said Mills Hatfield Rebecca his wife and James
Johnson his son and in consideration of the sum of Forty pounds
Lawful Money to them in hand paid the receipt whereof they
do hereby acknowledge themselves fully satisfied and paid have
hereby sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents do
hereby sell aliened and forever confirmed unto the said Mills Laurence
his heirs and assigns forever all the right title Interest possession claim
and demand of them the said Mills Hatfield Rebecca his wife and
James Johnson his mother a certain tract of Land which said Mills
Hatfield derived from his father Charles Hatfield lying in Southampton
County -
