and William Blod Gentlemen Justices of the peace for the County
of Southampton greeting Whereas William Hart and Betsy his
wife have by their certain Indenture of Bargain and Sale made
the 10th day of December 1805 conveyed unto Thomas D Price
of the County of Southampton the said Simple estate of and in
one acre of land adjoining Jerusalem Non Ruis etc that
whereas the said Betsy Hart cannot conveniently travel to the
Court of our said County acknowledge the same therefore send you
to you from time to time the Acknowledgment which the said Betsy
Shall be willing to make before you of the Overage aforesaid
contained in the said Indenture which is hereto annexed and
made thereon Command you to go personally to the Betsy and
Samuel Hart privately and apart from her husband whether he
hath executed the said Indenture fully and voluntarily without
the persuasion or threats of her said Husband, and whether she is
willing the said Indenture should be recorded in the County
Court of Southampton and when you have examined her aforesaid
and taken her acknowledgement of the said Indenture that you
distinctly and openly certify us hereof under your hands and seals
returning to us also this mid with the said Indenture annexed
