This Indenture made this 18th day of April 1806 between
 Richard Blunt and William Pope and Sally his wife, of the County of
 Southampton, of the one part; and William Tisbury, Esq^r, of the same County
 of the other part. Whereas, by Indenture bearing date the 20th day of Aug^r
 in the year 1806, of record in the County Court of Southampton, Britain,
 Pope did convey unto the said Richard Blunt, in trust, for the purpose
 of owing to Leyton Pope and John Woodward the payment of
 the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds over, Shillings Virginia Current
 with the Interest thereon accruing, to gather with all costs that might
 arise in carrying into effect the conveyance aforesaid, one certain tract or
 parcel of land lying in the said County of Southampton, containing
 by estimation one hundred and fifty acres, more or less, known by the
 name of Pope's tract and bounded as follows (viz) Beginning at
 River Warwick at the mouth of a branch in Benjamin Blunt's line,
 thence up the branch along Blunt's line to another Pope's line, thence
 along the said Pope's line to Voughans line, thence along Voughans line
 to Tisbury's line to the aforesaid River Warwick down the same
 to the beginning and whereas the said Richard Blunt, by virtue of the
 said Conveyance, having previously advertised the day and place where
 his affair public sale, the aforesaid tract of land and premises, when William
 Tisbury, for the consideration of two hundred and ten pounds, current money,
 became the purchaser and whereas the said Sally wife of the said Blunt,
 hath not made conveyance of the same in the lawes and premises aforesaid
 but is willing and desirous now so to do. Now This Indenture witnesseth
 that the said Richard Blunt, trustee aforesaid, and William Pope
 and Sally his wife, for the consideration of two hundred and ten pounds current
 money aforesaid to them, by the said William Tisbury in hand paid the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have given, granted, bargained,
