This Indenture made this 18th day of April 1806, between Richard Blount and William Pope and Sally his wife, of the County of Southampton, of the one part; and William Fitzhugh of the same County of the other part = Whereas, by Indenture bearing date the 28th day of Aug^r in the year 1806, of record in the County Court of Southampton, Britain Pope did convey unto the said Richard Blount, in trust, for the purpose of securing to Robert Pope and John Woodward the payment of the hundred and eighty five pounds ten Shillings Virginia Currency with the Interest thereon according to justice with all Costs that might arise in carrying into effect the conveyance aforesaid, one certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the said County of Southampton, containing by Estimation one hundred and fifty Acres, more or less. Bounded by the name of Pope's tract and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at the Swamp at the mouth of a branch in Benjamin Blount's line, thence up the branch along Blount's line to Nathaniel Pope's line, thence along the said Pope's line to Vaughan's line, thence along Vaughan's line to Fitzhugh's line to the Appraised River Swamp thence down the Swamp to the Beginning and whereas the said Richard Blount, by Virtue of the said Conveyance, having previously advertised the day and place of Sale did offer at public Sale, the aforesaid Tract of Land and premises, when William Fitzhugh, for the Consideration of two hundred and ten pounds current money, became the purchaser and whereas the said Sally wife of the said William, hath not granted Conveyance of her share in the land and premises aforesaid but is willing and desirous now to do as a Free Person This Indenture Witness that the said Richard Blount, trustee as aforesaid, and Benjamin Pope and Sally his wife, for the consideration of two hundred and ten pounds current money aforesaid to them, by the said William Fitzhugh in hand paid the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have given, granted, Bargained & Sold =
