 Robertson, their Executors, administrators and assigns, against the claim
 of him the said Frederick Robertson his heirs, & assigns, and against
 the claims of all and every persons whatsoever - shall and will
 warrant and forever Defend by these present Inventions whoso
 the said Frederick Robertson hath hereunto set his hand and
 affixed his seal this eighth day of March 1806
