 in the year of our Lord 1806 between Benjamin Dole and William F.
 L. Jenkins of the County of Southampton of the one part and Arthur
 Dole of the above said County of the other part Witnesseth that the said
 Benjamin Dole and William F. Jenkins for and in consideration of the sum
 of sixty pounds lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said
 Arthur Dole at or before the Signing and Delivered of these presents the receipt whereof
 of the said Benjamin Dole and William F. Jenkins both hands acknowledged and
 themselves therewith to be fully satisfied and paid and thereof doth clearly acquit and
 discharge the said Arthur Dole his heirs executors and administrators forever by these
 presents. hath given granted bargained sold enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents
 doth give grant bargain sell enfeoff and confirm unto the said Arthur Dole his
 heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing by Estimation
 of Acreage Six acres better or more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at
 Sleeping Rocks standing in the Mouth of the deep channel from thence up the said
 channel to a large pine from thence to a pine a corner two of Bordons and
 Joseph Brattle line from along along of marked trees through the plantation and
 through the orchard along of stakes to a small gum from thence along of marked trees
 to a white oak standing at the main road of black water so into the said road
 to the first station with all houses orchards gardens fences roads and
 natural water courses and with all profit commodities and advantages and
 appurtenances whatsoever present or future thereof
