Know all men by these presents that I James Bradley of the County of
Hallifax and State of North Carolina for divers good causes and considerations me there
unto moving, but more especially for the satisfaction of the sum of five shillings to me
in hand paid by Samuel Lee, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted
bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain & sell unto the said Samuel
Lee his heirs and assigns forever, one negro woman called Ursay with her future
increase; To have and to hold the said negro woman Ursay with her
increase as aforesaid unto the said Samuel Lee his heirs and assigns to the only
proper use and behoof, of him the said Samuel Lee his heirs and assigns forever
And I the said James Bradley for myself, my heirs, executors & assigns do warrant
and defend the title of the aforesaid negro woman Ursay with her future increase
unto the said Samuel Lee his heirs & assigns, against the claim & demand of all
persons whatsoever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &

between George Gurley and Lucy his wife of the one part and John Gurley of the
other part, Witnessed, that the said George Gurley & Lucy his wife for and in
consideration of the sum of one hundred & twenty five pounds to them in hand paid
by the said John Gurley the receipt whereof the said George Gurley and Lucy his
wife do hereby acknowledge in both parties, bargain and sold and by these presents
do grant bargain and sell, alien in full & confirm unto the said John Gurley
his heirs & assigns forever, one certain tract of land containing by estimation
one hundred & forty five acres more or less, and bounded as follows, Beginning in
the rear of the Cypress swamp a corner of Pilgrim Vicks, & descending thence land
thence along a line of marked trees to a small old oak a corner of said Vicks
