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This Indenture, made this 19<sup>th</sup> day of February

Went in the year of christ 1806, between, Thomas Wood and Cherry his wife  
both of the county of Southampton of the one part and Thomas Gray of said county  
of the other part witnesses, That whereas the said Thomas Wood is entitled  
to a certain portion or dividend arising from the sale of lands slaves & personal  
property devised and bequeathed to him in the last will and Testament of his  
deceased father Thomas Wood dec<sup>d</sup> and whereas he may by the death of the said  
deceased decedent and legatus of Thomas Wood decedent be entitled to a certain portion  
of the estate devised to them by the said Thomas Wood dec<sup>d</sup>; the said Thomas  
Wood and Cherry his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one  
hundred pounds lawful money of Virginia, by the said Thomas Gray  
to the said Thomas Wood in hand paid, the receipt whereof the said Thomas  
Wood at hereby acknowledges and forw<sup>th</sup> acquits and discharges the said  
Thomas Gray. The said Thomas Wood, hath granted bargained, sold  
aliened and transferred, and by these presents doth grant bargain, sell, and  
transfer unto the said Thomas Gray his heirs and assigns forever all his right title  
interest, claim, or demand whatsoever to the said several decedent and legatus in the  
said last will and Testament of Thomas Wood dec<sup>d</sup> to him devised and bequeathed  
and also all the right, title, interest, claim, or demand whatsoever which may here-  
after accrue to him by the death of the said instant decedent and legatus of Thomas  
Wood dec<sup>d</sup>; or any of them, to the decedent and legatus respectively given them in the  
said last will and Testament, together with all and every advantage, emolument  
and interest in any wise appertaining to, or to be derived from the estate of  
the said Thomas Wood dec<sup>d</sup>; To have and to hold to the said Thomas Gray his  
heirs and assigns, to the only proper use & behoof of the said Thomas Gray, his  
heirs and assigns forever, in as ample a manner as the said Thomas Wood, would  
or could have done in case the conveyance had never been made, and the said  
Thomas Wood for himself, and his heirs, the said decedent and legatus and every  
part thereof, against himself and his heirs and against all and every other person  
and persons whatsoever, to the said Thomas Gray his heirs and assigns, does, shall  
and will warrant, and forw<sup>th</sup> assign by these presents, In witness whereof  
the said Thomas Wood & Cherry his wife have hereunto set their hands and  
affixed their seals the day before above written
