Elizabeth Bottle, her executors administrators and assigns forever, but upon
this special condition notwithstanding, that Thomas Westbrook shall have the ma-
nagement of the said negro girl Cynthia for the use of and for the accom-
pany of Lucy Bottle during the term of her life; and to have the said Lucy
Bottle shall give all the profits and emoluments arising from the said girl
and her increase, and the said James Folk for himself his executors & administrators
upon the above said condition, the said negro girl Cynthia and her increase
unto the said Elizabeth Bottle, her executors, administrators and assigns, against the
claims of him the said James Folk, his executors and administrators, and against the
claim or claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever, shall and well warrant
and forever defend by these presents, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 19th day of June, in the year 1810
