This Indenture, made this twenty fifth day of March
Eighteen hundred and six, between John Foster of the one part, Williams &
Wharton of the second part and William Simmons of the third part, all of
Southampton County & State of Virginia, Witnesseth that whereas the said
John Foster, stands justly indebted unto the said Williams & Wharton by his
obligation of this day for the sum of ninety pounds & seven shillings & two
pence & current money of Virginia, on demand Now this Indenture
witnesseth that the said John Foster hath for and in consideration of the sum
of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said William Simmons, with good
Sanguine Bond and by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said
William Simmons, and to his heirs and assigns forever, two negroes, namely
Sarah, & Cary her son, to and for the following intent, use & purpose, that
is to say, that he the said William Simmons, may & shall at any time after the
first day of August next when thereunto required by either of the parties, sell
at public sale for ready money, giving ten days notice, either or both of,
the within mentioned negroes, as well be of value sufficient to pay and satisfy to
the said Williams & Wharton the amount of the within mentioned debt, interest
and the costs of executing this Indenture as also any other debt which the said
John Foster may at that time be owing to the said Williams & Wharton, and
the balance of any pay & return to him the said John Foster his heirs or assigns
for Witnesseth whereof each of the parties have hereunto set their hands & seals this
twenty fifth day of March 1806.
