

This Indenture, made this 25th day of October in the year
of our Lord 1805, between Brunwell Killings and wife Mary of Southampton County
of the one part and Charles Williford of the same County of the other part, witnesseth
that the said Brunwell Killings and wife for and in consideration of the sum of
three pounds current money to them in hand paid by the said Charles Williford
the receipt whereof the said Brunwell Killings and wife doth hereby acknowledge
they the said Brunwell Killings and his wife hath granted bargained and sold alien
enjoyed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien enjoy off and confirm
unto the said Charles Williford his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or
parcel of land containing two and a half acres be the same more or less situate
lying and being in the County of Southampton on the north side of Nottingham river
and bounded as followeth to wit, Beginning at a white oak on the river bank
thence N. 33. W. 40 poles to a brook on Henry Briggs' line, S 15. E. 34 poles
to a white oak, and from thence to the beginning, containing two and a half
acres and also trees woods, underwoods, commons, common of pasture profits, con
monities, advantages emoluments, hereditaments and whatsoever to the said tract
or parcel of land above mentioned belonging or in anywise appertaining or in
or upon the same growing, happening or arising and also the reversion, remainder
reversion and remainders present & to come of the said premises and of every part &
parcel thereof and also all the entire right title interest claim and demand
whosoever of they the said Brunwell Killings and wife of in and to the same
premises and every part thereof To have and to hold all and singular
the said premises above mentioned and every part and parcel thereof with the
appurtenances unto said Charles Williford his heirs and assigns forever & the
said Brunwell Killings and wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract
of land and every part thereof against the reversion and their heirs and assigns to
all and every other person and persons whatsoever to the said Charles Williford
his heirs and assigns their and well warrant and forever defend by their
presents, In witness whereof the said Brunwell Killings and wife hath
hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day & year above written
