This Indenture, made this 15th day of February in the year of our Lords 1805, between Reynold Lundy of the County of Southampton, esq^r of the one part, and John Harris of the County of Southampton of the other part, Witnesseth, that the said Reynold Lundy came as aforesaid and in conformity of the last will and testament of the said Mary Branch, a duplicate of which will is duly recorded, in the County Court of Southampton and for in consideration of the sum of the sum of twelve hundred & eighty two dollars, seven pence, to him the said administrator in hand paid by the said John Harris at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said administrator hath granted bargained, sold, aliened, confirmed, and with by these presents, bargain, sell, alien and confirm unto the said John Harris his heirs and assigns forever all and singular the right, title and interest which the said Mary Branch had in or to one piece, parcel or tract of land containing by late survey two hundred thirty nine three quarters acres, be the same more or less, lying & being in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, on the north side of Meherrin river and bounded as follows the Beginning, at a stump a corner of Appriels line, thence with 11 degrees North 88 paces to the road, thence up the road to a red oak, Right Lundy's line, thence along the said right Lundy's line North 58 degrees West 50 paces to a white oak, on a large pond, thence along said path to a red oak a corner of said right Lundy and said land and Elizabeth Williams line, thence along said Mr Williams line South 66 degrees West 36 paces to a red oak, thence South 3-
