This Indenture, made this 10th day of July, in the year of our Lord
 1806, Between Arthur Turner of Southampton County of the one part, & Edwin
 Turner of the other part, Witnesseth, that the said Arthur Turner for and in consi-
 deration of the sum of four thousand dollars to him in hand paid by the said Edwin
 Turner at and before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof
 of the said Arthur Turner, with hereby acknowledge, and thereof with receipt the
 said Edwin Turner, his heirs, assigns and assigns, both present, hereafter, said, alive
 and after, confirmed, and made over unto the said Edwin Turner his heirs and assigns forever
 all that tract or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Southampton
 in Virginia on the south side of Mattawoman River, bounded as followeth, to wit:
 Beginning, at a point in the south prong of Buckhorn Swamp N. N. 1/4 pole
 to a white oak in person's line, thence S. N. 310 pole to a red oak in the
 said Indian line, then S. E. 1/4 pole down the said Indian line to a white oak in
 the south prong of said Swamp, then round the Indian corner of said Swamp to a
 white oak a corner tree in Benjamin's Reddick's line then N. 1/4 N. 66
 pole to a red oak then N. 20 N. 170 pole to a pine, then S. 10 N. 142 pole
 to a white oak in the west prong of said Swamp, then up the Swamp to the beginning, Con-
 taining Eight hundred & ten acres by the same more or less, with the divisions
 and divisions and remains or remainders, To have and to hold to the said Edwin
 and singular his improvements, conveniences, advantages and benefits forever, or
