

246 This Indenture, made this 1th day of August 1806, between
 Robert Madry Sheriff and as administrator with the will annexed of John Barrow
 late of Southampton County of the one part and Benjamin M. Johnston
 of the same County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Robert
 Madry as administrator as aforesaid, agreeably to the last will & bequests
 of said John Barrow dec^d hath for and in consideration of the sum of
 one hundred and fifty dollars and seventeen Cents granted bargained and sold
 and by these presents hath granted bargained and sold unto the said B. M. Johnston
 and to his heirs and assigns forever, one certain Lot of Land, known by the name
 of Oakley or Chas. lying on the East side of the road leading from the City
 Keys to Barancho's Bridge, and being all the Land of said Barrow from Peter
 Thier's garden to the road. To have and to hold the said Lot of
 Land forever unto him the said B. M. Johnston his heirs assigns forever
 And the said Robert Madry as Sheriff and administrator as aforesaid doth hereby
 warrant and defend the title of said Lot of Land unto him the said B. M. Johnston
 and to his heirs & assigns forever, against the claim and demand of him or his
 heirs executors, or administrators or against the claim and demand of the heirs of
 the said John Barrow dec^d or any other person whatsoever, In Witness whereof
 the said Robert Madry, hath hereunto set his hand and Seal this 4th day of
 August one thousand Eight hundred Six

 William Birdson and Martha his wife and Benjamin Birdson of the County of
 Southampton and parish of parsonage of the one part and Arthur Bowring of
 the same parish and County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Wm Birdson
 and Martha his wife & B. Birdson for and in consideration of the sum of twenty
 six dollars & eighty eight Cents good and lawful money of the Virginias to them
 in hand paid by the said Arthur Bowring the receipt whereof the said Wm Birdson
 Birdson & Martha his wife and B. Birdson doth hereby acknowledge themselves
 infinitely satisfied contented & paid, with grant bargain and have sold aliened
 and confirmed & by the presents hath granted bargained and have sold unto the said
 Arthur Bowring his heirs & a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in
 the aforesaid parish & County containing by estimation thirty three Acs 2 R 20 P
 be the same more or less, and bounded as followeth, beginning at a white oak
