 five shillings of our lawful currency money of Virginia and being willing to give
 to secure the payment thereof have as well for the consideration of the aforesaid
 sum of

as also the sum of one dollar

to be paid to me in hand by David Westbrook as trustee for the said Joseph James
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged & the said John P. Westbrook have granted
 bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Joseph
 James the following property to wit one negro woman named Sarah and one
 girl Lettice and two head of horses to have and to hold the aforesaid property
 unto the said David Westbrook, to his heirs and assigns of the said
 Joseph James his heirs and assigns in full and complete satisfaction and discharge
 and purpose that if the above sum of Forty pounds five and four pence remain unpaid
 unto the said Joseph James his heirs assigns or assigns at or upon the delivery
 of the said property to David Westbrook his executors or assigns shall the giving
 hereof make void the aforesaid property to public sale at any time
