

Indentures of bargain and sale, dated the 9th day of January 1804, conveyed unto James Spranger of the County of Southampton, the fee simple estate of and in 151 acres of land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid, and whereas the said Mary cannot conveniently travel to the County of our said County to acknowledge the same, therefore we do give to your power to receive the acknowledgment which the said Mary shall be willing to make before you of the conveyance aforesaid contained in the said Indenture which is hereto annexed & we do command you to go personally to the said Mary and in and to her privately and apart from her said husband, whether she hath consented or not, to be her husband and to do so, without the persuasion or threat of her husband and when you have received her as aforesaid, and received her acknowledgment of the said Indenture, that you distinctly certify in writing, under your hand and seal, returning to us also this writ with the said Indenture annexed, Witness our hand & Seal of our said Court at the Court house the 8th day of January 1804, and 3rd year of the Commonwealth. —
