

and being in the County of Southampton in the north side of the flat swamp being part of a tract of land formerly belonging to John Wetherborne dec'd & bounded as follows to wit beginning at a white pine in the hunting quarter board, thence along said Manna's line to a bushy, thence along said line to a white oak a corner of Thomas's land, thence along said Thomas's line to a white pine in Dennis's board, a corner of John's land, thence up said board to a pine a corner of Lewis's Sharps land, thence along said Sharps line to a corner of King's Westbrooke's line, thence corner the various courses of said hunting quarter, to the first station to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances unto the said Joseph Sumner his heirs & assigns together with all profits & commodities advantages heretofore obtained and also the Revenue & revenues & remaining rents and saving of the said land premises & of every part thereof, & also all the estate rights title interest claim and demand & advantages of the said John P. Wetherborne his heirs executors &c. of us & to the said land premises above mentioned and every part thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Joseph Sumner to be only proper use & behoof of the said Joseph Sumner his heirs and assigns forever & the said John P. Wetherborne for himself his heirs the said land now growing & every part thereof against me my heirs & against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, the said John P. Wetherborne, his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant & defend by these presents. In Witness whereof the said John P. Whithers This Indenture, made this 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 1807, between Betsy Whithers of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Isaac McNamee of the County and State of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Betsy Whithers for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars, to her in hand paid by the said Isaac McNamee the receipt whereof is the said Betsy Whithers' acknowledgment and being to be thereby fully satisfied entered and paid, hath granted bargained and sold all her right title interest and claim, and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien convey and confirm unto the said Isaac McNamee, his heirs and assigns, the several and sundry interests which she hath in that part of the land and premises of which her father Brother Whithers was seignior and proprietor, and which are as appraised and set apart to her under the authority of the said Betsy, as her share, to have and to hold the said several and sundry interests, to have of the said Isaac McNamee his heirs and assigns forever, that is to say that at the date of the above foregoing (at present only known) that the said Isaac McNamee
