This 1st instant, made the sixth day of March 1807, between
Joseph Bonnue of Southampton County of the one part and Francis C. Walker of
Mechanicsburg County of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Joseph Bonnue is now
to secure the payment of five hundred pounds over Richard H. Walker of Mechanics-
burg County by him, payable the first day of January last, and in consideration of the
sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Francis C. Walker at or before
the making and delivery of these presents the writer whereof is hereby acknowledged,
in the said Joseph Bonnue, hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth
grant, bargain and sell unto the said Francis C. Walker the following slaves, to wit,
Dick, Ralph, Erasmus, Mead, Lachlan and Daniel, their uses then future income,
to have and to hold the above mentioned property and their future income unto the said
Francis C. Walker, his heirs, executors and assigns forever. Upon trust, nevertheless,
that the said Francis C. Walker, shall after giving thirty days notice to be advertised
in some publick newspaper published in Petersburg, prosecute all the same to the
highest bidder for the best price that can be obtained, and out of the money arising from
the sale in the first place to satisfy and pay the uses above mentioned, all removal
charges attending such sale, and the residue of the money arising from such sales
so far as may be paid to the said Joseph Bonnue, for money which the particular
slaves so then bound, bears the day before first shown. Witness—
