 of the one part, and Samuel Calvert of the County and State aforesaid of the other part
 Witnesseth that the said William Burns for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand
 six hundred and thirty three dollars, current money of Virginia to him so have paid
 by the said Samuel Calvert the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, by the said
 William Burns and wife his wife, both grantees hereunto and witness affixed
 and affirms, and by these presents doth bargain sell alien superf^d and confirm unto the said
 Samuel Calvert his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land contain-
 ing by estimation three hundred and twenty and one half acres, in the same manner left,
 situated lying and being in the said County of Southampton, on the north side of Mattaponi
 river and bounded as follows, first beginning at a sweet gum, near the fork of the road leading
 to south quay & the three Cypress lines, in the said Calvert line, thence S 45° W 100 pds
 to a red oak, near the three Cypress road in said Woods line, thence S 30° E 54 pds
 to a pine in said Woods line, thence N 60° E 50 pds to a oak in said Woods
 line, thence S 74° E 60 pds to a pine in said Woods line, thence N 40° E 24 pds
 to a small white oak in Sugarmills line, thence N 32° M 56 pds to a pine
 oak in said Woods line, thence N 50° E 40 pds to south quay Road, thence N 43° E
 62 pds to a black gum in the long swamp, thence up the said swamp by marsh
 to a black gum, a man tree, thence N 73° E 12 2 pds to a small white oak
 in Woods line, thence along the middle of, up the same from swamp to a willow
 oak a man tree in said Calvert line, thence S 69° M 40 pds to a pine in said
 Calvert line, thence down the stream S 43° E 18 pds, thence S 30° E 58 pds, thence
 S 44° E 90 pds, thence S 29° E 22 pds, thence S 65° E 28 pds to the
