This Indenture, made this 12<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & five, between Euseb Boys & Millicent his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and William Lundy of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Euseb Boys and Millicent his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred & thirty eight dollars & fifty three cents to them in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said William Lundy at or before the executing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said William Lundy his heirs and assigns a certain tract, piece or parcel of land, being and being in the said County of Southampton on the south side of the three Cracks extending by late survey one hundred & fifty five & three quarters acres be the same more or less & bounded as follows, beginning at a black oak a corner of George Boys line thence north thirty seven degrees, pole to a cluster of bay trees in a branch thence down the bank to a maple a corner in Rivers line, thence along said line, south sixty eight degrees and 59 pole to a stake, thence north 18 1/2 degrees West 19 pole to a white oak thence north 74 degrees West 19 pole to a sweet gum, on the back run thence down the bank to the main run of the three Cracks, thence up the bank to a black gum a corner of Thomas line, thence along said Thomas line south 32 degrees East 58 pole to a maple on the said back run, thence down the said run to a large sweet gum in Thomas line thence along said line south 12 pole to an oak, thence south 13 degrees East 66 pole to a poplar, thence south 42 degrees West 4 pole to a small gum in the branch, thence up the said branch to a white oak on the head of the branch south 85 degrees East 114 pole to a small pine in Thomas line thence north 55 degrees West 19 pole to a pine, thence north 66 degrees West 64 pole to the front station.
