 never or assigns with double covenant, promise and grant to and with the said
 Henry Jones and Elizabeth his wife their heirs & assigns by these presents, shall &
 will covenant & forward defend, the said land, unto the said Henry Jones & Elizabeth
 his wife, against the right, title claim or demand of any persons or persons claiming

This Indenture

made this 21st day of February 1807, between Henry
 Jones and Elizabeth his wife & Benjamin Jones & Patsy his wife all of the County of
 Southampton and parcel of mortgage that whereas the said Henry Jones & Elizabeth
 his wife & Benjamin Jones & Patsy his wife hath mutually bargained & agreed
 to change tracts of land the said Henry Jones & Elizabeth his wife agree to give unto
 land and premises, whereas James Jones did say and possess which land was now
 by a decree of the Marshfield Court of Southampton County, and the said Henry
 Jones became the purchaser, unto Henry Jones & Patsy his wife for the land was
 promised whereas the said Henry Jones and Elizabeth his wife now live. Witness
 that the said Henry Jones & Elizabeth his wife doth both acknowledge themselves
 fully and amply satisfied in the above or amount of land, hath granted, bargained
 & sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents with grant bargain
 & sold unto the said Benjamin Jones and Patsy his wife the above mentioned tract
 of land containing by estimation three hundred twenty eight acres, be the same
 more or less and bounded as follows beginning at a pine standing on the west
